

QUAKER PARROTS

Found normally in S. and Central America, this little bird is quickly populating many states right here in North America.

Green on their backs, blue on their wings and tails with a grey chest and yellow beak, these guys are amazingly resilient animals that pave the way of possibility for other parrot species.

Currently, Quaker Parrot Populations are even found right here in WA state! Mostly in Port Orchard area. Flocks also reside in Illinois, New York, New Jersey, Texas, California, and Florida, to name a few. Even the coldest of winters do not deter them.

They nest in colonies unlike most parrots who nest in tree cavities. The colonies are usually found around large palm trees, but also often are found around electric poles for warmth. The birds are often sited to being a pest but have yet to be proven to displace native bird species.
